
### Message from Sandy Schneirla, Vice President VA4WDA and business member!

This year, the annual VA4WDA Earth Day Trail Maintenance Day was held April 12 in the Glenwood-Pedlar District of the George Washington National Forest. We had 26 volunteers, including 2 volunteers under the age of 4. We met at the Sherando Lake Campground's William Branch Day Use Area pavilion at 9am for a briefing from our President, Jesse Schneirla and Brian from the Forest Service.

After the paperwork was signed, tasks were assigned, we grabbed our trash bags, grabbers, and gloves, and went out in 3 groups to the Coal Rd from the bottom, the Coal Rd from the Parkway, and Howardsville Turnpike. A dump site off Mt Torry Rd was cleaned on the way to the Coal Rd. The day before a group of 4 went to Tank Hollow and hauled appliances up a



cliff and collected furniture and litter.



Our volunteers cleaned dispersed campsites, pulled appliances up a cliff, retrieved tires, and hauled furniture. We overfilled a 12 cubic yard dumpster (graciously paid for with a grant from Tread Lightly! again this year) and still could have collected more litter. Next year we will apply for additional grant funds and rent 2 dumpsters.

Free camping (thanks to our agreement with the US Forest Service) and Saturday dinner were back in the day-use area where a fire was burning in the pavilion fireplace. Business member Southern Yankee Homestead brought 5 dozen farm eggs

and Tread Lightly! provided 2 hoodies for our door prize give away. We put out a donation bucket and collected \$102 for our charity, the Nelson County Pantry.

### Thinking of an Engine Swap?

If you are, the most important thing is to plan ahead. Don't start tearing anything apart until you've accumulated most everything that you'll need to finish the job or you could be stalled with no end in sight. Remember all the little stuff, make lists. Get the gaskets, the vacuum plugs, new spark plugs, the right/new motor mounts, plug wires, oil, break-in oil, hoses, distributor...whatever is going to be needed. The list can be quite long. Get the equipment that you'll need lined up, a hoist, a floor jack and an engine stand can all be quite handy and, sometimes, better than the tree in the backyard with a pulley. Even if you're swapping in the same engine, just a fresh one, you'll probably want to take the opportunity to clean up everything under the hood and replace a bunch of the worn out and questionable



stuff. It can become a deep rabbit hole to climb into and cost two, three or even four times what you were expecting. I'm currently replacing an AMC 360 with another AMC 360 and have managed to go far deeper than I expected. Yeah, probably should have done the LS, but that's what everyone else has done.

Next, try to arrange some help. I've been working on mine by myself. Getting up and down every time you need another tool or a paper towel can really wear on you quickly. Also, it's tough to watch some things and get the engine out or in, work the hoist and reach for a tool at the same time. In the end, you have to manage with what you have to get it done. Lastly, document everything with lots of pictures, notes of what every wire and bolt is that you take loose. I put masking tape with notes on wires, brackets and parts. Remember to put it back on after you clean or paint those parts, too.

### Message from Mark Mormando, VA4WDA Land Use Coordinator

My old 2006 car trailer has a ton of miles on it, has been coast to coast, and lots of places in between. It's towed its share of off-road rigs, classic cars, building materials, and lots of scrap metal runs. Never really think about the maintenance on it until something happens - axle bearings seized up, spring failure, brakes that don't work, or rotten wood deck... So, I decided it was time to do a little rebuild on mine.

This all started with replacing the old and rotten decking. I stripped the deck and removed all the old rusted and broken bolts, holding the boards to the trailer frame. I bought the new pressure treated lumber at a local Home Depot. I ordered some carriage bolts, washers, and nuts to secure the new decking. I picked up some new angle iron for the



rear dove tall section to hold the flat decking area to the dove tail section. I made it so it bolted on instead of welding the ends down. After which I decided to build some heavy-duty fenders. 3/16" plate steel and a little planning made them so they could bolt on and off. Very stout, unlike the thin 16-gauge factory ones. While checking bearings and repacking them, I found the spring hangers were worn out. So, I ordered some new leaf springs, hangers, and greaseable bolts. I cut all the old stuff off and installed the new. I got the tires and wheel cleaned up and reinstalled. I had a new

9500 Bandlands winch in the garage, so I mounted that on the trailer for those unexpected times when things break. I had an old large plastic storage box laying around. I figured I could use it for the battery and storage. I had to weld a couple of supports across the trailer tongue so the box could be bolted on. Mounted a battery box inside and winch power on/off switch. I drilled a couple of holes for the winch wiring to run through, wired up the switch and battery. I found a couple 4" cube LED lights and mounted them to the rear of trailer. They are great for when backing up in a dark area or when loading up at night. I did a quick black paint job and added some new reflective decals. It almost looks new. I replaced some old broken lights with some new LED's. Had to remove the old crusty wiring, and replaced that with new wiring. Now it just needs an inspection sticker, and it's ready for its next road trip. Next



time I will be adding a 30 watt solar panel to help maintain the charge on the battery.
